Denplan and dental emergencies

The holiday season is fast approaching so make sure you pack Denplan's emergency telephone numbers along with your flip-flops. Their emergency helpline is open 24 hours a day, seven days a week and is there to help you in the event of a dental emergency when you are 40 miles or more away from Collins House.

If you need help to find a dentist overseas, we recommend that you discuss your needs with your hotel concierge, your operator representative or any family, friends or colleagues that you may know in the area first. The Denplan number you need when you are overseas is 44 1962 844 999.

Dental first aid tips

- Clean the area around the sore tooth thoroughly
- Rinse your mouth vigorously with lukewarm (body temperature) salt water to dislodge trapped food or debris
- Do not use very hot or very cold salt water as this may inflame the gums
- Do not place aspirin on the gum or on the aching tooth
- If your face is swollen, apply a cold compress and seek help from a dentist as soon as possible
- Cold water rinses may temporarily ease the pain from a throbbing tooth
- Avoid lying down as this raises the blood pressure and increases pain
- If a permanent tooth is knocked out, rinse it gently in water if it's
 dirty, and push the tooth back into its socket. If this is not possible,
 put the tooth into milk or saliva to keep it moist. Get to a dentist or
 hospital casualty department as soon as possible



Parish lines

Next time you pay us a visit be sure to look on the wall at the front of the building. There are two roundels separating what was St. Owen's parish from St. Peter's parish.

Historically, parish lines were boundaries separating parishes according to the location of churches. Records indicate that the parish church of St. Owen was destroyed during the Civil War and never rebuilt. Marked on a Hereford town plan is an outline of a large graveyard on the opposite side of St. Owen's Street stretching as far as Daw's Road. This may have been St. Owen's graveyard but it is not certain.

The parish of St Owen was also the location of St Owen's Gate, one of the 6 gates into the city, which were removed in the late 1700's.
